

Patrol: Man Uses False Name To Buy Car

The Nebraska State Patrol has issued an arrest warrant for a man who they said used a false identity to buy a car.

Kevin Wayne Scoggin, 52, is wanted on suspicion of theft by deception, fraud by impersonation, forgery and title fraud.

Investigators said Scoggin used a Colorado driver's license that had the name Nash A. Zamora when he bought a Toyota from Sid Dillon's dealership in Lincoln.

An investigation showed that the Zamora information was fraudulent.

On Oct. 26, the Topeka, Kan., Police Department recovered the Toyota from a couple attempting to purchase the car from a man identifying himself as Nash A. Zamora. Topeka police then arrested a man claiming to be Zamora at a Topeka bank as he was waiting to cash a check from the couple for the purchase of the vehicle, the state patrol said in a news release.

Scoggin is currently being held at the Shawnee County (Kansas) Community Corrections Department.
